





NORTHERN IRELAND HAS many wonderful places to visit and with two new sites joining our regular fabulous duo, you can take your time over a tour and tackle it all in comfort.

Start with Delamont Country Park and visit
Belfast and the fantastic Titanic experience. Move
down the coast to the Province's southern tip and
Sandilands for the Mourne Mountains and stunning
beaches. Then head west for Rushin House and the
Fermanagh Lakelands and its newest attraction, the
Cuilcagh Boardwalk, aka Stairway to Heaven.

Your final stop is the north Antrim Coast, where a pitch at Ballyness gives you a base for exploring the rugged and windswept shores made famous by TV's *Game of Thrones*. Take in the extraordinary sight of the 40,000 basalt columns of the Giant's Causeway, walk across the narrow Carrick-a-Rede bridge, and tour the Bushmills Distillery. Then venture inland and explore the countryside around Lough Neagh, the largest lake in the British Isles.

This linear Club site on the east coast is a new entry for Northern Ireland. It sits next door to Delamont Country Park, home to the Strangford Stone, Ireland's tallest megalith, and is just a short distance from Strangford Lough, the largest inlet in the British Isles. It's a great location, giving easy access to coast, countryside and mountains.

The site is bordered on one side by trees, on the other by fields, and is served by a modern washblock with the usual facilities, including a parent and baby room and facilities for the disabled. All are spotless.

From the small shop, you can pick up basic groceries. There's no play area for children, but they have a park next door, where they will find an outdoor adventure playground and miniature railway, and the heronry is bound to fascinate. There's also an outdoor gym.

Just a mile away is Killyleagh, which boasts a castle, shops and restaurants. Strangford Lough has a wealth of wildlife, including seals and porpoises, and is one of only three Marine Nature Reserves in the UK.



The spacious hardstanding pitches are laid out across three areas, one near a pond surrounded by trees, where you can listen to birdsong and watch the antics of swans and moorhens. The other two are near the play area, which will suit families. All pitches have electric, water and drainage points.

The heated washblock includes wet-room showers, dishwashing facilities, baby changing and family rooms, laundry and facilities for the disabled.

Bring your four-legged friend - there's a dedicated eight-acre dog walk where they can stretch their legs. A football field, play area and indoor games room should keep the children happy.

In summer the Causeway Coastal Rambler bus stops outside reception to whisk you to the Giant's Causeway and the Carrick-a-Rede rope bridge, while Bushmills, with its shops, cafés and distillery, is a short walk away.

Be mindful that you will need a 25-metre hook-up lead to be a safe six metres away from other units, though. It's useful if your reversing skills are poor.

Last year's Heart of England Regional Winner has this year taken the main prize, with a huge number of you voting for this pristine adults-only park.

The touring park was developed in 2012, but the fisheries side, comprising 10 fishable lakes, has been running since the early 1990s.

Since our visit last year, a new touring area, Southern Meadows, has opened. All 69 of its hardstanding pitches are fully serviced, have wonderful views and sit adjacent to the 4.5-acre carp lake. This area has a pond at its centre and is served by two state-of-the-art washblocks, each with an accessible wet room and individual bathrooms.

The Northern Acre touring area has 61 pitches, 47 of which are fully serviced, served by four five-star amenities blocks, one with dedicated disabled facilities.

The site's popular bar/tearoom now has clubhouse facilities, with free Wi-Fi and a pet-friendly area. The tearoom opens daily for breakfast, lunch and afternoon tea, while the bar opens on a seasonal basis. There's a programme of events throughout the year.

Touring isn't the only option here, with 12 lodges and several glamping superpods available for hire.


Dog-owners are the site's biggest clients, says manager Craig Oldham - they come for the fantastic dog-walks around the lakes and in the surrounding countryside - and Craig reckons around half the guests visit because of the fishing. But there are also some very pretty villages nearby. Rutland Water is just a half-hour drive, with Stamford and Burghley House only 40 minutes away. • For full details of the site, see p66


