



NORTHERN IRELAND

A magical land of mythical giants, legendary landscapes and major history, including the birthplace of the mighty *Titanic*

Northern Ireland has undergone something of a renaissance over the past few years: it's a fantastic place to visit, offering a warm welcome, breathtaking scenery and vibrant cities – it's become a popular touring destination.

Just a short ferry ride across the sea from Cairnryan, or a rather longer one from Liverpool, will take you right into the centre of historic Belfast, with the *Titanic* attraction close at hand, or to Larne, from where the world-famous Giant's Causeway is easily accessible. And don't miss the spectacular scenery of the Mourne Mountains, and the region's many lively seaside towns.



NORTH-WEST ENGLAND

This region incorporates everything from towns that were the powerhouse of the Industrial Revolution, to quiet peaks and valleys in the Lake District.

But there's much else to inspire, too, with quirky places such as Blackpool, and historic cities, including Lancaster. And that's before we've even begun to list the pleasures of the cultural mecca that is Liverpool.

There are plenty of local food specialities – Blackpool Rock, obviously, but also Cartmel sticky toffee pudding and even black pudding, originating in Bury. And which are better – Eccles cakes or Chorley cakes? You can decide!



WALES

Historic castles, great cultural centres and the spectacular scenery of Snowdonia can all be enjoyed in this glorious setting

Make the gorgeous valleys and mountains of Wales your next tour destination and you're sure to have a trip to remember! There's simply so much to see and do here. In the north of the country, you'll find a trio of Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, including the stunning Isle of Anglesey, which attracts wildlife from far and wide. Slightly better known is Snowdonia National Park, with its soaring peaks. Further south is Brecon Beacons National Park, ideal for hikers, as is Pembrokeshire National Park. HEART OF ENGLAND

Take your pick of spectacular natural wonders and historic architecture, set against a backdrop of iconic landscapes

Stretching from the Welsh border east to Leicestershire, and from Oxford north to Cheshire, this region is packed with historical interest and natural wonders. Don't miss the dreaming spires of England's oldest university, Oxford, the cradle of great theatre in Shakespeare's Stratford-upon-Avon, and the iconic Ironbridge, birthplace of the Industrial Revolution.

Then there's stunning Blenheim Palace, Haddon Hall and Chatsworth House. It's also wonderful for walkers, with the Peak District National Park, the Wye Valley and the Shropshire Hills just waiting to be enjoyed.

EASTERN ENGLAND

Enjoy wonderful walking in the glorious scenery of the Fens and Wolds, and discover a slower pace of life among the windmills and waterways

With wonderful resorts along the Norfolk and Suffolk coasts, exquisite fishing lakes in the Fens, marvellous walking in the Wolds, and the watery wonder that is the Broads, this is a superb area to visit. A magical place of gentle cycling paths, smooth waterways and whimsical windmills. No matter where you choose to stay at, you're sure to find something nearby of interest!

There are the famous Broads of Norfolk for starters – you can really get back to nature by hiring a boat to explore them fully – as well as the historic city of Norwich, with its handsome cathedral. Suffolk, meanwhile, offers plenty to see and do, including the towns of Bury St Edmunds, Ipswich and Lowestoft. The Lincolnshire Wolds are another firm favourite with visitors.

DORSET

Explore the ancient geological history of the fascinating Jurassic Coast, then relax on the beach in splendid seaside resorts

One of Britain's prettiest counties is waiting to be explored, and what better way to do so than in a caravan? If you're a beach lover, head to the south of the region, where you'll find the sandy shores of Weymouth and Bournemouth; walking the shingle of Chesil Beach and the rest of the Jurassic Coast will also make for a wild and wonderful day out.

Dorset is famous for its picture-postcard villages, of course, and it's really easy to head off the beaten track to find them. Welcoming and pretty towns in the area, meanwhile, include Sherborne, Blandford and Gillingham.

The South Downs National Park is another draw here, and you can't miss a trip to London! Other towns and cities to see are Southampton, Brighton and Dover. And, of course, that's not forgetting the wonderful Isle of Wight.



DEVON

With two glorious coastlines and two iconic National Parks, you won't be short of things to do in this gorgeous region

Devon offers so much to see and do, it's impossible to experience everything during one trip – which, of course, is a great excuse for you to keep revisiting. The rolling hills of Dartmoor are just one of the many attractions, as are the coastlines, north and south – they vary in feel, so be sure to visit both to choose your favourite. 

SAVE MONEY ON TOUR!

Penny for your thoughts? These days, it will cost us more than that! Here are a few easy ways to keep down touring costs

Travel on weekdays and, it goes without saying, avoid school and bank holidays if you can – off-peak campsite rates are often cheaper.

Watch your speed – as well as being safer, you'll save a good amount of fuel if you drive just a little slower.

Set the right tyre pressures. This will make your car and caravan safer, and reduce fuel consumption.

Use a campsite finder website, such as Pitchup, to find cheaper sites – many let you sort results by price, so you can bag a good deal.

Are you a pensioner, a student or a family group? Track down discounts and offers on local websites, or in magazines, libraries and arts centres. Membership of either The Camping and Caravanning Club or the Caravan and Motorhome Club can make your touring cheaper, and if you seek out their CSs or CLs, you'll find they offer excellent value for money, especially on weekdays.

Give up those expensive frothy Frappuccinos. Instead, make up a pot of Moka coffee in your van (or instant if you prefer!).

It's stating the obvious, we know, but a packed lunch is going to save you £££s.

Shop like a local. Yes, it's good to have Hobnobs and Marmite on tour (although perhaps not together), but don't pay crazy prices for them overseas.

Instead, revel in shops and markets where you're sure to find excellent local products. *Fromage*, anyone?



We are all painfully aware that fuel prices are scarily high, so it makes sense to shop around. Try apps such as Petrolprices.com, which seeks out the best prices for fuel in your area. Every little helps!

If you're on site with electric hook-up, run as much as you can off electric rather than gas – consider a low-wattage electric grill.

Stay local. If you just want a quick break, save on fuel by booking a local campsite. Then you can explore all those bits of your locality you never got round to discovering.

Toll roads can be expensive, so use the AA or RAC route planners to avoid them (assuming it won't cost you more in fuel). Your trip might be slower, but it's all about the journey, right?

It's lovely to be spontaneous and go whenever you feel the call of the road, but a bit of planning can save cash. Think special offers, supermarket vouchers and competitions. Try myvouchercodes.co.uk.

Take a look at CampingCard ACSI. A subscription is 17.95 euros and can save up to 60% per night at more than 3000 sites around Europe when you tour during the low season.

A shared bag of chips on the prom is as good an experience as eating at a fancy harbourside restaurant – cheaper, too!
